COVE APPLES ON THE ROAD

LAST OF 20-CAR SHIPMENT SENT OUT YESTERDAY.

Most of the Crop Bought but the Bulk Still to be Shipped.

Cove, Nov. 23.—(Special)—The last car load of a 20-car shipment of Cove apples, purchased by White Bros. & Crumb Co., of Lewiston, through Garrit Oldenburg, was shipped out yesterday, and though most of the apple crop is already bought, there are still considerable quantities of apples yet to go out.

Prices have been round the dollar mark for most of the apples purchased thus far and the growers are faring well financially.

O'SULLIVAN OUT AGAIN

INJURED BRAKEMAN ABLE TO LEAVE PORTLAND HOSPITAL.

Young O. R. N. Employee Injured Recently En-Route to Joseph.

Passenger Brakeman James O'Sullivan, who was seriously injured near Telocaset two months ago when he stepped from an O. R. & N. passenger train at night and fell to the bottom of a culvert, was released from the hospital in Portland last Thursday, and was in La Grande this morning en route to Joseph. Mr. O'Sullivan is now practically over the effects of the fall but will not resume his run for a few days yet.

To Elect Congressman.

Chicago, Nov. 23.—A special election is being held in the Sixth Congressional District today to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Congressman William Lorimer. William J. Moxley is the regular republican candidate, and Frank S. Ryan the democratic aspirant. Carl L. Barns appears as an independent republican nominee by petition.

The election will be taken as an indication of popular sentiment in the middle west. The democrats are confident of victory, declaring that "Cannonism" and the Aldrich tariff bill are sufficient to defeat any republican candidate. The union labor element is showing great interest in the outcome.
