Bank of Commerce Ends Case in the Supreme Court for Defendant.

Word was received yesterday that the Supreme court had handed down a decision in the case of the Bank of Commerce vs. Charles Bertram of North Powder. The bank appealed but was again beaten as the court sustained the previous decision of the lower court. The case involved a property settlement between Cavette and Bertram, a former partner in the bank.
