BOOTLEGGERS PRISONED

WALLOWA BARBER HAS TROUBLE WITH THE COURT.

Twenty Days in Jail and a Cash Fine Meted Out to Him.

Another bootlegger has been sent to the county jail by Judge Knowles and will be given an opportunity to handle the pick and shovel for Wallowa county. The last trial of the strenuous term just brought to a close in Enterprise was that of the State vs. James Fisk.

Fisk was a barber in Wallowa who made some money yielding the razor and scissors but complimented his income by disposing of intoxicants. At any rate he was so convicted and sentenced to pay \$100 and serve 20 days in jail.

LAUDERMILK AGAIN SUED

Following out the policy of sledgehammer tactics adopted by W. J. Townley through his attorney, Chas. E. Cochran, to drive L. D. Loudermilk off the Tule Lake homestead near Hot Lake, Loudermilk was arrested again yesterday on a similar trespass charge as the one under which he was tried before Justice Williams of this city last week. Justice Williams has certified the complaint to the circuit court.

Loudermilk was notified Sunday to vacate the claim just as he was previous to the first arrest. He refused and was arrested a second time. This time he will be tried before Justice Maxwell of Union.

The second trial will constitute the legal "multiplicity of suits" which will enable Townley to bring an injunction suit against Loudermilk. This will be one. Townley and his legal advisor say that with the state fighting Loudermilk in the land office and they after him in the courts he will have an interesting time of it.

Loudermilk is defended by Attorney John S. Hodgins who holds that a criminal charge of trespass under the circumstances is absurd since Loudermilk has the land office receiver's receipt, the advice of the district attorney and the state district attorney back of him to prove that he went upon the land in good faith thinking the land was vacant.

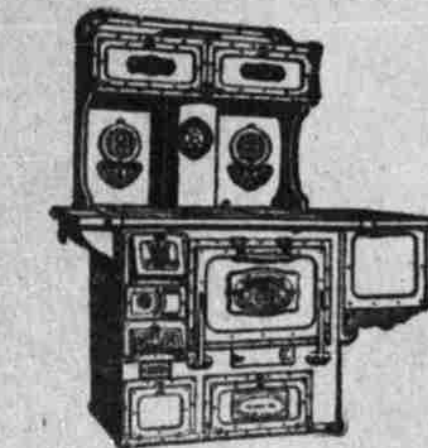
