Lecturer of Extensive Travels Will do Picture-Talk Attraction

Under the auspices of the Commercial club of this city Mr. Prince of San Francisco will appear in an illustrated lecture on the evening of Dec. 2. The lecture will consist of descriptions of the magnificent scenery on the banks of the Columbia, to Portland and from here to various points South as far as Catilena islands.

The pictures showing the rapid development of San Francisco since the fire will be of especial interest to the public. From that city the journey continues by way of Burlingame, Redwood City, San Mateo, San Jose, Palo Alto and on through the Santa Clara valley to the Yosemite valley, the chief cities being described.

Santa Barbara with its splendid driveways is described and the story of the old missions is told. Los Angeles is shown and talked about, also Pasadena that city of millionaires.

At the islands of Catilena the trip closes. There are 150 colored slides supplemented by a series of moving pictures.

## CEMETERY PLOT FILED

In the filing of the plot of the Summerville cemetery today the history of one of the oldest cemeteries in Eastern Oregon is revived in the memory of the pioneers. The Summerville cemetery is one of the largest cemeteries in Union county and was in the early days the county burying ground. There are few pioneer families in Union county today who do not have some close ties binding them to that spot of ground.

J. L. Woodell, president of the cemetery association, is in the city today looking after the recording of the land. He says that work is continually being done on the grounds and that it is being kept in fine condition by the people. Contributions to the president and directors for the carrying on of the work are made by people from all over the country as the plot is dear to the memory of the old timers.

## FLOUR GOES UP AGAIN

INCREASE OF TWENTY CENTS A BARREL QUOTED.

Local Dealers Advised that Wholesale Prices Jump 5c a Sack.

Flour has gone up. While the rise in price does not compare in size to the increase at Portland, still the difference here is material. Flour selling at \$4.60 per barrel wholesale is now going at \$4.80 which makes a difference of five cents on the sack, all grades. In Portland the increase is three times as much.

Local retail dealers were notified of the change this morning and are now selling local flour at that quotation.

Wheat Correspondingly High.

With wheat rising, wheat is correspondingly on increase, and as reported yesterday, is commanding a dollar for the forty-fold. With wheat growers realizing this lucrative remuneration for their crops, flour consumers can at least smile at the income of others while paying the higher prices.
