Sometimes it is thrown out later in the way of a lingering catarrh—and sometimes, very often in fact, in the form of la grippe—the extra burden is thrown on the kidneys and that is one reason that the kidneys are so often affected as a sequel to this frequent trouble. The kidneys would not have been affected if the cold or grippe had been treated sensibly or even left alone, but when the excretory process of the cold was interfered with, the trouble was transferred to a weak spot and permanent—sometimes fatal—injury is the result.
