WINTER OATS INTRODUCED

Is about to Sew a Large Field of winter Oats Near Imbler.

One of the first experiments with winter oats to be tried in this valley is being tried by S. L. Brooks of Imbler this fall. While in the city this morning Mr. Brooks said that he had several teams plowing right along at the present and that he would sow his oats in a few days if the open weather continued.

The oats are from the Willamette valley. Owing to the fact that they were late in arriving the sowing has been delayed. Only about six acres will be sown this fall. A few years ago Mr. Brooks tried a winter variety but they proved to be unsatisfactory. This time he has the gray oat which is said by the Willamette farmers to be the best variety.
