**WILL RESTOCK THE BUNKERS**

It has been announced that the O. R. & Co. is planning to refill the local coal bunkers in the near future. It will be remembered that in the latter part of July fire broke out in the coal and in order to extinguish the deeply laid flames and save the coal from destruction, practically the entire amount had to be hauled out. In the bunkers where the fire occurred about 20,000 tons of coal was stored.

When the refilling begins a large crew of men will be put on. While the exact grade of coal that will be brought in has not been announced it is certain the company will try a different kind in order to prevent if possible a reoccurrence of the disastrous bunker fire of last summer. The coal in which the fire broke out last summer was valued at about \$140,000.
