## RALEY PLEADS GUILTY TO FRAUDS

MANY PENDLETON PEOPLE ARE ADMITTEDLY GUILTY.

John McCourt Pleads for Mercy for the Confessed Land Fraudster.

Portland, Dec. 1.—Concluding the famous Umatilla reservation land fraud cases, which have been dragging for months, after the indictments were returned by the Federal grand jury, all of the defendants, 15 or 20 in number, this afternoon entered pleas of guilty in the United States district court before Federal Judge Wolverton. The most sensational plea was that of Attorney James H. Raley, of Pendleton, Oregon, one of the most prominent lawyers of Eastern Oregon, who was indicted on the charge of conspiring to obtain government land illegally, with other defendants. Raley made a strong plea for leniency to the court.

Col. Raley in his plea before the court said: "I have never intentionally violated any law and never intentionally did any man a wrong. My connection with these cases is an open book. I have nothing to conceal. I am wholly innocent as I believe are every one of my brethren. I am now speaking for the rest of these defendants as well as for myself. All of us believe that we have acted within the pale of the law."

Raley was called to plead separately after he had addressed the court. He exhibited much emotion. All of the defendants were called forward and Attorney Henry McGinn entered a general plea of guilty.

United States District Attorney John McCourt, in speaking from the position of a government attorney, and not as a personal friend of many of the defendants, described the case in detail and asked the court to extend leniency. He told of the manner in which the lands, 120 claims or more, were obtained by the defendants through arrangements and by a contract with actual settlers, with whom they made contracts and to many of whom the filing fees were advanced before the land was taken up. With the exception of John Vert and the defendants appeared in court. They were Colonel Raley, John W. Crow, Alonzo Notts, William Caldwell, William Rabe, John Wynn, William Elacher, C. W. Mathews, John Vert, Percy Ross, Sam Olin and J. F. Parks.
