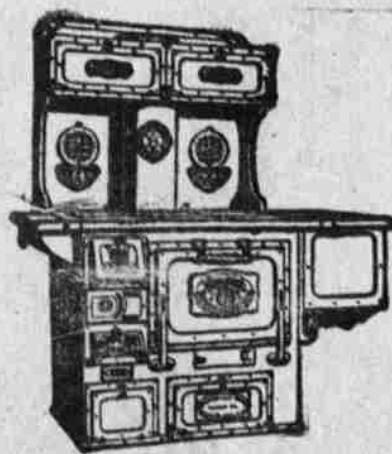

## J. W. SCRIBER TO TESTIFY

TESTIMONY IN SUIT OVER SECURITIES TO BE TAKEN.

Scriber, Chief Witness to be Heard Tomorrow on Stand.

J. W. Scriber arrived this morning from Portland and while here will testify in the case of J. F. Phy, trustee vs., the Bolton-Bodmer company, in which he is one of the chief witnesses. The case involves the title to certain securities which were turned over to the Bolton-Bodmer Company on the Saturday night before the bank closed its doors. The securities were turned over to secure a bank deposit.

The trustee contends that the securities were the personal property of J. W. Scriber and that he had no lawful right to pledge it to secure a depositor of the bank. The testimony will be taken in the case tomorrow.

## BIG STREET IMPROVEMENT

One of the most extensive street improvement crusades that has ever hit La Grande was started at the city council meeting last night when three new resolutions creating improvement districts was passed and others read and taken under advisement until the next meeting. The resolutions were in accord with that portion of Mayor Hall's message referring to the "disgraceful condition of the streets," and also stating it to be unfair to the property owners along the east end of Adams avenue who were paying for the improvements there to have the remainder of the city remain in its present muddy condition.

The improvement resolutions passed last night designated Fourth street from C street to Palmer avenue, as District No. 2, and declares for its improvement by macadamizing. Another called for the improvement of Greenwood street from Adams to T avenue. A third renews the resolutions to pave Adams avenue from Fourth to Hemlock streets.
