## SEEMANN RETURNED

HAS ATTENDED ADVISORY COUNCIL AT NEW YORK

The Northwest delegation to the Advisory Council on Church Extension of the Presbyterian church of the United States, held in New York City, returned yesterday via the extreme southern route through New Mexico and California. Dr. S. W. Seemann of this city was Oregon's representative, while Dr. Wilson of Seattle went from Washington and Rev. J. H. Barton formerly of Union, went from the state of Idaho.

In the opinion of Dr. Thompson, chairman of the home board, the meeting marked an epoch in the work of the Presbyterian church. The councillors felt especially enthusiastic over the work owing to the recent bequest of \$13,000,000 from John Stewart Kennedy of New York City. Over \$7,000,000 of this goes to the Presbyterian boards.

One of the ends toward which the church is working is a self supporting synod. Each state synod is making an effort to look after the work of the church extension within its own borders.

Dr. Seemann reports a fine trip in which he enjoyed himself and gained new inspiration and encouragement in the future of the church.
