O. A. C. News.  
Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Dec. 10.—Special.—The Oregon Agricultural College exhibits at the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition won the gold medal offered for the best educational exhibit. Grand prizes were also awarded to each of the seven departmental exhibits.  
The Oregon Agricultural College winter short course which commences on January 4th, and continues for a period of six weeks will be the most complete ever offered. Practical work in every line of agriculture, dairying, horticulture, domestic science and art with road building and the business methods of the farm will be taught. An exceedingly strong staff of instructors will have charge of the work. The equipment for demonstration and experimental work is the most complete ever used at the college.  
There are twelve literary societies with an average membership of thirty at the Oregon Agricultural college. Six hundred and seventy men are drilling in the cadet regiments at the college this season.  
The college now has two regiments and two regimental bands.
