WILLIAMS RESIGNS

ASSISTANT CASHIER WILL DEVOTE TIME TO ORCHARDS.

After Twelve Years Affiliation with Local Bank Will Resign.

After several years successfully operating and investing in orchard lands Assistant Cashier, Sherwood Williams of the La Grande National Bank, has handed in his resignation to take effect next April, and will sever his connection with that institution, with which he has been connected for the past twelve years, to give his undivided attention to the planting of an orchard on a forty acre tract recently purchased from F. M. Hoffeditz. This tract lies directly east of and joins the town of Imbler and is considered to be well worth the price of \$4,800.00 paid for it.

Mr. Williams for several years has been convinced that the fruit industry offers exceptional inducements to those who go into the business intelligently and believes that the management of the proposed orchard will prove beneficial not only as a business venture but as a change from the confinement of the years of office work.

Mr. and Mrs. Williams do not intend to make their recently acquired property their home for the present at least, but during the planting and cultivating season will personally direct the setting out of the orchard which will consist of Rome Beauties, Ganos and Jonothans. These varieties have been thoroughly tested in this valley, growing to perfection, and in their season fill the demand of the buying public.
