give a correct name to the condition, the osteopath seeks to find out the cause of it. It is this effort to ascertain the cause that is the real keynote of osteopathy's success. For when the cause is found it is obvious that there is more hope of correcting the condition.

For instance you may have a very painful trouble that is due simply to pressure upon a nerve, as is usually the case for instance in sciatic or neuralgia. It is very plain that drugs given to temporarily quiet the pain cannot affect a permanent cure. Yet the osteopath is the real doctor who tries to find the point at which the pressure is occurring and to so correct the bodily adjustments as to relieve it.

It is not always the case although very usually so, that there is a body misadjustment. Contracted muscles and other conditions in the softer tissues of the body are often responsible. Any of these abnormal anatomical conditions may, through pressure upon sensory nerves, cause severe pain; or may, by effecting the distribution of nerve forces, derange any organ of the body which is dependent in any way upon the nerves affected.—Osteopathy Herald.
