More interest was taken at the annual meeting of the Commercial Club last night than for several years, the object being the election of officers, and a general discussion for the good of the community.

President Collier presided and an informal address reviewed the working of the club since its last annual meeting which includes the securing of the present convenient commodious quarters, the large amount of literature which has been scattered to all parts of the country in response to advertising placed in magazines and farm papers, of which a liberal supply is still on hand; the securing of a public manager; the purchase and the maintenance of an exhibit hall; securing the good roads convention; the launching of the irrigation project and securing the \$80,000 subscription; having a float in the Portland Rose show; maintaining an exhibit and having a man in charge during the of the Seattle fair; the inauguration of the county fair, which was the most successful fair held in many years, placing La Grande and the Grande Ronde valley in the same position as Spokane by taking action in the rate cases; securing the stopping over in our city of the L. D. S. choir and the Spokane Apple Show exhibit.

The above is what the club has actually accomplished. President Collier in addition to these, foresees much work in the future. One is to assist in the organization of a fruit growers union, which will send forth a pack that will give our county a standing and be the means of securing better

prices. The first effort, possibly will be the taking up of the chautauqua. President Collier is much in earnest as are all members of the board, for they are in possession of actual conditions which presents us, to wit: if we do not secure the chautauqua during the next 30 days, we, by our own inactivity, will be left, as another city has laid the foundation for it and will secure it. This place has made little if any public announcement but they are ready to act and to act at once.

President Collier also mentions the possibility of securing a railroad to Walla Walla and that La Grande should be ready to assist at the first opportune time. The committee in charge of arranging matters for the coming poultry show asks the Commercial Club to assist them on their first attempt financially to the extent of \$40 and this was cheerfully done, unanimously. The club realizes that this industry should be encouraged as it is a well-known fact that as much poultry and poultry products are shipped into this valley as is produced here.

At the request of W. L. Van Durn that the Commercial Club investigate the merits of the La Grande Manufac-

turing company, which has just been incorporated to manufacture a new automatic threshing machine. A committee consisting of Wm. Miller, G. L. Cleaver, Geo. H. Currey, E. L. Eckley, W. B. Sargent, F. L. Myers and Mac Wood were appointed to visit the plant and examine into the merits of the model now on exhibition and report at the next meeting.

The La Grande Commercial Club is one of the live wires of this city and county.
