FARMERS AND DIRECTORS WILL MEET TOMORROW AFTERNOON

Decide on Wording of Contract for the Prospective Water Users.

No meeting of recent months is of more importance to the valley than a committee meeting tomorrow at 1 6 clock between the five representatives from the prospective water users and the directors of the Grande Ronde Irrigation Company. The men to repre sent the waterusers are Duncan Mc Donald, Sam Brooks, C. D. Huffmann, John McAlister and J. A. Thronson. These men will agree with the directors on what clauses and the wording of the clauses that are to constitute the contract to be signed for the waterusers. In meetings past, it became clear that there are no material differences in the demands of the waterusers and the stipulation of the contract already prepared. Things the farmers are demanding are included in the present contract, but the phrase ology is not to their liking. At tomorrow's meeting the contract will be worded so as to embody the features now contained in it, but in different language.
