POSTOFFICE CONGESTED

CHRISTMAS PRESENTS PILE HIGH IN TWO DAYS.

Unable to Clear Congestion Today is The General Opinion of the Postoffice Authorities.

LA GRANDE WILL OPEN DEBATE SEASON THEN.

Triangular Affair Between Locals, Elgin and Enterprise.

On January 7th the high school will hold its first series of debates for the state championship. The triangular system will be used for the first debates. Elgin will debate in La Grande against the affirmative team of the high school while Enterprise will debate in Elgin against the affirmative team and La Grande will debate in Enterprise against the affirmative team of that city. These debates will occur on the same night and will be on the same question.

The judges have not been decided on at this time. The team of the La Grande high will be as follows:
The affirmative team which will debate with Elgin is, leader, George Kerr, second speaker, George Curry, and third speaker Roy Curry.
The negative team which will debate with Enterprise is, leader, Joe Engles, second speaker, Will Hamilton and third speaker Arlo Meyers.

Good Roads in Washington.
Seattle, Dec. 27.—Every county in the state is to send its commissioners to the meeting of the good roads movement to be held in Aberdeen, January 20th and 21st. From 300 to 500 delegates are expected to be present to discuss the expenditure of the \$1,500,000 appropriation and to formulate general plans for the permanent development of trunk lines. Samuel Hill is expected back from Europe in time to participate, while talks of great value will be given by Engineer Thompson of Seattle, who will illustrate by means of an stereopticon practical methods to be used. Other experts on road building will be present and will deliver talks on these subjects. The idea is to build main trunk lines of good hard road throughout the state, cross sectioning both east and west as well as north and south that will be available not only for the use of the farmer but for the swiftest automobiling in all kinds of weather and under all conditions.
