Undergraduate Mingles With the Pro-
ducts of Big Schools.

Corvallis, Ore., Jan. 10.—Special.—The winter short courses opened at the Agricultural college Tuesday Jan. 4 with the largest and most representative body of students in attendance. There are men and women ranging in age from 16 to 65 years and representing almost every walk in life. Side by side with the girls and boys from the ninth and tenth grades of the public schools of the state are graduates of Brown, Yale, Lake Forest and other great Eastern and middlewestern universities and colleges. There are farmers and fruit-growers who own or manage farms ranging from 5 to 2500 acres. There are teachers and housewives, stockmen and dairymen, horticulturists, business men and capitalists. This representative attendance speaks well for the future of the Agricultural Oregon.
