ELLIS HAS BRIGHT HOPE

HOPES TO SEE FEDERAL BUILDING COMMENCED SOON.

Indications say that the coming summer is the Earliest Possible Date of Construction.

United States Representative W. R. Ellis writes from Washington D. C. that the best he or the Oregon delegation can do is to have the La Grande Federal building built next summer. In a letter to the local business men, the representative says: "I am in receipt of your letter of recent date as well as numerous other letters from citizens of La Grande making inquiries regarding the federal building to be erected in your city. I have had a personal interview with the supervising architect of the treasury and he informs me that they will take the matter up as soon as it can be reached in its turn.

The title to the property was not secured until less than a year ago and in consequence thereof numerous other buildings secured precedence for construction, as they will not take these matters up out of their turn. He thinks that La Grande cannot be reached until some time during the coming summer. He informs me however that he will use every effort to reach it at the earliest possible day.
