#### To Try Alleged Blackmaller

Cincinnati, Jan. 10—Mrs. Jeanette Steward Ford, who is charged with blackmail connected with the embezzlement of \$643,000 from the local offices of the Big Four Railroad by C.

L. Warriner, will be placed on trial today. Warriner has been held in the jail here as the principal witness in the case. When the Ford trial is concluded he will go to Columbus to begin a six years sentence in the state penitentiary.

### TWO DEATHS IN FAMILY

LOCAL BRAKEMAN RECEIVES THE NEWS OF DUAL DEATH.

Husband Died Saturday and Wife Follows Husband this Morning.

Singular visitations by death to

one family is told in two telegrams received today by Robert Amburn, a brakeman employed by the O. R. & N., of this city. The first message told of the death in Louisville Ky., of his brother-in-law, John D. Ashton. His death occurred on Saturday from acute rheumatism. Today another message informed him of the death of the deceased's wife, Ina F. Ashton, a sister of Mr. Amburn. Few details accompany the telegrams, except to the effect that Mrs. Ashton died in childbirth.

M. Auburn intends to leave tonight for Louisville, to attend the funerals.
