UNITED STATES NATIONAL DIRECTORS IN MEETING

Stockholders find Profit in First Year of the Business

Stockholders of the United States National bank met in their first annual meeting late yesterday afternoon and elected a directorate to conduct the affairs of the bank for another year. All were re-elected with the exception of E. P. Staples who withdrew on account of having moved to Telocast. J. C. Henry of this city succeeds him. The directors for 1910 are N. K. West, Wm. Miller, H. E. Coolidge, T. J. Scroggins, C. T. Bacon, J. L. Caviness, Frank Conley, A. T. Hill, and J. C. Henry. The directors immediately after re-elected the entire official slate, which went in office when the institution was organized. A rather unusual condition in banking history was disclosed at the meeting when the account showed a profit for the first year, a fact seldom possible in banks even two years old. The institution has been in existence 11 and one half months.
