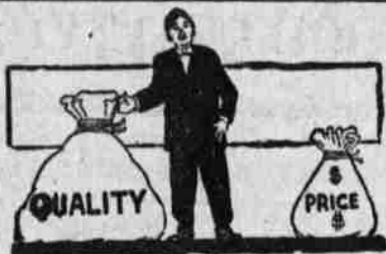

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SHOES MAY BE HIGHER

Boston, Jan. 14.—An advance in the price of shoes to the wearer is one of the probabilities under discussion at the convention today of the shoe and leather industries of the United States, which is being held under the auspices of the National Shoe Wholesaler's Association. It is alleged that this is one of the most important trade conferences held in Boston in many years, and may have a vital effect on the shoe industry.

The primary purpose of the convention is a discussion of the all important question at present confronting the trade—that of prices. The specific topics to be discussed by speakers of national reputation will be as follows:

"Are we confronted with a radical advance in the prices of leather and shoes? What effect will free hides have on the situation?"

"Will the buying public prefer fixed prices, or will they demand a standard quality at the market price?"

"Is there any good reason why the shoe and leather industries should not share in the general prosperity of the country?"

Many of the speakers include some of the most prominent manufacturers and dealers in the trade.
