Everything has been done to make this show an educational center for chicken fanciers and an attraction for the lovers of the useful and beautiful. No efforts have been spared in calling for exhibits and if the best the valley affords is not in evidence at the show the promoters of the same will have an incentive to work one year hence. The public is invited to attend the show and see some of the things that can truly be called the Grande Ronders. It is expected at different times the judge will make a talk on the care and raising of pure blooded birds and as the question of eggs is an important one at the time being, perhaps information relative to the feeding for egg production might be profitably listened to. Other features besides bird exhibits are prospective. A keen competition is expected between R. T. birds, Leghorns, Wyandottes, Orpingtons, and Rocks and I am sure every visitor will have ample opportunity to satisfy any desire he may have to compare the afore mentioned birds, according to their different strains. All entries must be in by Jan. 18 as the show doors open by nine o'clock Jan. 18. The price of admission will be 15c, and the place will be Herris' Hall.
