In this period of Oregon politics, ed assembly plan are of interest. A Portland paper in enlarging on the proposed methods, says:
It Is suggested by these Repubilcans that one delegate be elected to cinct in the state. In the larger precincts the representation would be baced on the voting strength of the party, one additional delegate betng ers or major fraction theres 100 votsome other slmillar basis.
The Idea proposed
that each precinct have a representation in proportion to fts voting strength. In order that the state assembly shan be representative of every county, the practice of giving
proxies under this system would be ltmited to the delegates elected from
that county or to some other member of county or to some other me
of the party in the same county. It is urged by those favoring this plan that while such an assembly
might be considered too large by might be considered too large by
some, it would not afford an oppor tunlty for anti-assembly men to charge that the gathering was controlled by any combination in the interests of and particular set of can-
didates. didates. If the selection of delegates to the state assembly is left
to the county assemblles to the county assemblles it ts ar-
erred by the advocates of the larger erred by the advocates of the larger
state assembly that it will be easler for sellish candidates to control or
at least influence the selection at least infuence the selection of
state delegates by the county as state delegates by the county as
semblles. Where the membershitp of the state asseclicts, it is contended tham the opportunity for organizing the state gathering in the interest of any particular candidate or candidates will be serionily curtalled.
