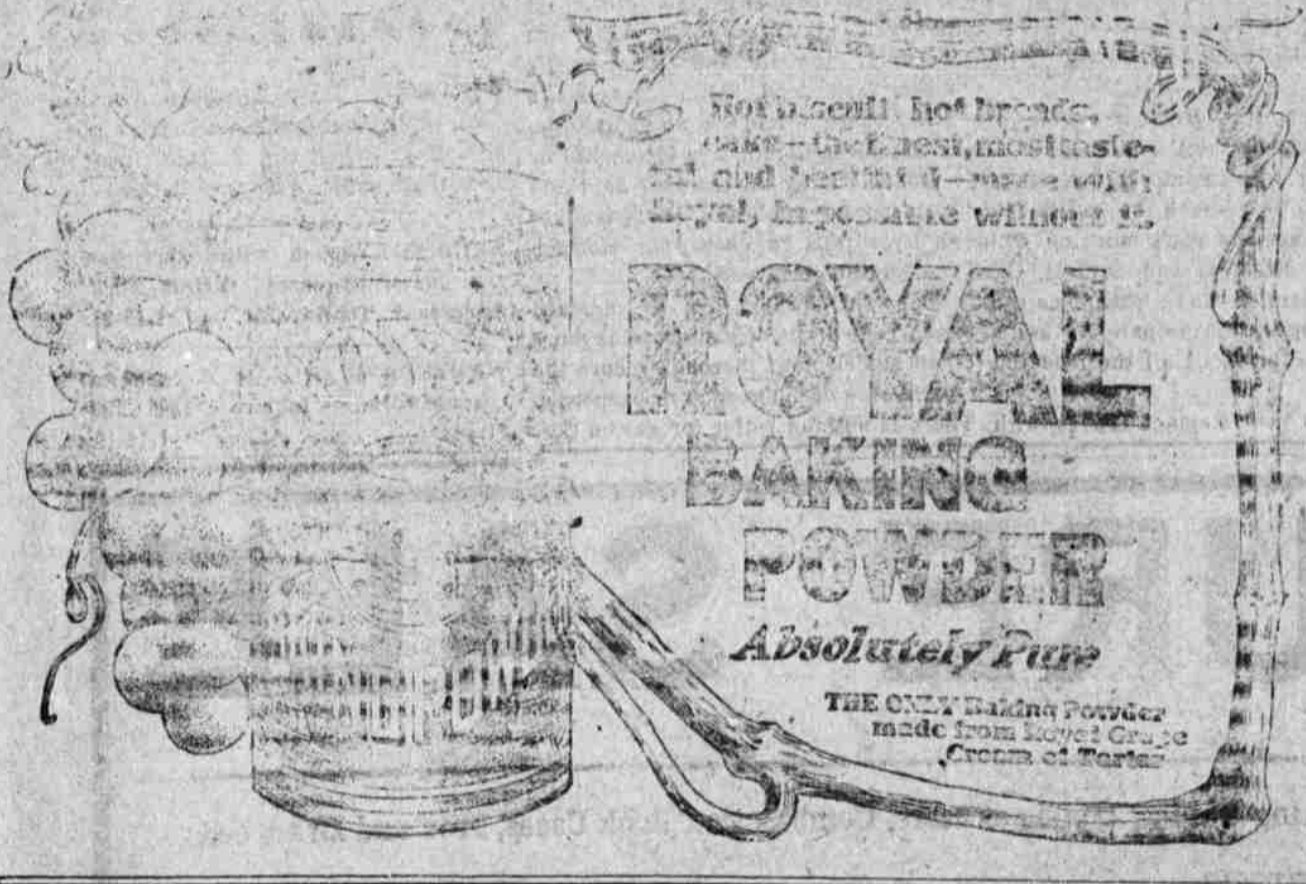

### Negro Workers' Conference.

Tuskegee, Ala., Jan. 20.—Delegates from about two hundred schools and colleges in different parts of the South attended the second day's session of the Tuskegee Negro Conference. The meeting today, known as the "Worker's Conference," is a sequel of the meeting held yesterday, which was attended by negro farmers from the country districts and from many parts of the South.

The special subject of discussion today was, "How can the schools aid in increasing the productive efficiency of the people?"

Some of the leading colored educators of the country took part in the discussion, which included consideration of various allied topics.

### Tariff League Meets.

New York, Jan. 20.—Members and subscribers of the American Protective Tariff League gathered today at the national headquarters, 339 Broadway, to hold their annual meeting, and felicitate each other on the part played by the league in keeping the recent tariff "revision" within bounds.

After the preliminary discussion the league will elect five members for four years and one member for two years. The board of managers will also hold its meeting today for the election of officers for the ensuing year, as well as the designation of executive and standing committees for 1910.

There appears to be some doubt in some quarters whether Mr. Moore can be persuaded to serve another term as president. His business connections are so extensive that it has been with difficulty that friends of the league have prevailed upon him to retain the office. In view, however, of the imminence of tariff revision last year, Mr. Moore accepted the unanimous election as executive. During the revision, the tariff league exercised its influence in congress in a correction of alleged weaknesses in the administration features of the Dingley act, with the result that many of the defects in the old law stand corrected in the act of 1909.

### Dry Goods Trade Good

New York, Jan. 20.—That 1910 will be a highly prosperous year for the dry goods trade is the prediction of a majority of the delegates in attendance at today's session of the National Wholesale Dry Goods Association. Jobbers are here from all sections and the optimistic spirit is apparently widespread.
