OLMSTEAD A PIONEER

PIONEER ATTORNEY OF EASTERN OREGON HERE.

When he was young he was judge over vast E. O. District.

Judge M. L. Olmstead, who is probably the pioneer attorney in Eastern Oregon today, if not in years, in the point of service, is registered at the Hotel Sommer. How time changes, the physical condition of the country as well as man. When Judge Olmstead was on the bench, his district comprised what was then Grant, Baker, Union, Umatilla and Wasco counties. Courts were held at The Dalles, Pendleton, Union, Baker City and Canyon City.

Wallowa county has been made out of Union, Malheur out of Grant, Morrow out of Umatilla and two or three counties out of Wasco. Judge Olmstead served four years in the Civil War, his son, taking to the military, is now awaiting a command on one of our peace missionaries, commonly known as war ships. For many years the Judge has made his home in Baker City and enjoys a large and remunerative practice. With him is associated W. H. Strayer, also well known in this county.
