# FIRST CLASS SEWERAGE SYSTEM PLANS ARE NEARLY DONE

Engineer Darley is putting the finishing touches on the sewerage system he has been working on since December 1st. Four days more will finish all of the office and field work, with the exception of the disposal plant. Whether or not the council desires this completed at the present time will be decided upon at the next meeting.

Every portion within the present city limit is provided for and Engineer Darley states that there is ample fall, however, on the north side of the track. There will be automatic flushing tanks provided in certain districts.

The main sewer pipe will range in size from 6 to 16 inches. The majority will be of the smaller size.

The system provides for two septic tanks to be at present of sufficient

capacity to provide for 4000 people, so arranged that additional tanks may be added as required. At the start, two such tanks with a capacity of 2000 people is provided. The pipe will be under ground on an average of eight feet but this will vary to conform with the grade.

When the data is turned over to the city everything will be plotted, so that any property owner who will visit the office of the City Recorder can know exactly where his tap is situated, the depth, amount of dirt to be excavated, the size of the connections—in fact the plans and specifications are complete in every detail. The cost to the city will be about \$750, which is cheaper by over one half than several engineers offered to do the work for.

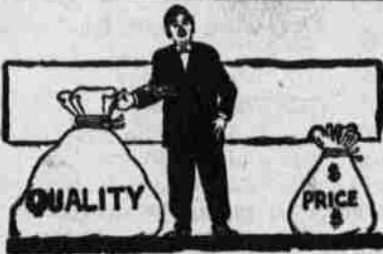
