ANNUAL NEW ORLEANS EVENT
WILL OPEN TOMORROW

Many auto racing features attend the big show this year.

New Orleans, Feb. 2.—Thousands of visitors, representing the advance guard of the vast crowds expected here during the next five days' poured into New Orleans today and were entertained by the initial events of the Mardi Gras program. Balls and festivals of all kinds have been arranged for each night. The streets and business houses have been arranged and decorated as they have seldom been before and tonight the whole city will be flooded with light. Arrangements have been completed for the Mardi Gras automobile racing meet, which will be held on Saturday and Sunday. This meet promises to be one of the best attended in many years. Several features have

been added to the program, among which is a distance race between chassis of all kinds, irrespective of class, free for all, the prize being the Mabel McCane trophy, valued at \$500. This cup, which is ornate in design, is donated by Miss Mabel McCane, of St. Louis and Chicago, an enthusiastic motorist. Other races are: A twenty-five mile race for stock chassis, three classes of piston displacement, trophies to class winners, \$250 added, donated by the hotel association; a five mile New Orleans championship contest, open to New Orleans contestants only; a fifty mile race for all stock cars, classified as
