Hire New Teacher.

Davenport, Wash., Feb. 3.—The Davenport School board has hired another teacher for the high school to carry on the agricultural work. Davenport was the first school to adopt this work and 20 boys are taking the course. Eight are studying agronomy and 12 breeding and fattening of stock. There are now 110 in the high school out of a total enrollment of 504. The average percent of high school enrollment throughout the state is 12 while Davenport has 22. The new teacher is Miss Ada Baker, a graduate of W. S. Vestry meeting Monday evening, 7:30. Superintendent J. L. Thayer graduated from the Spokane high school in 1902 and from W. S. C. in 1907.
