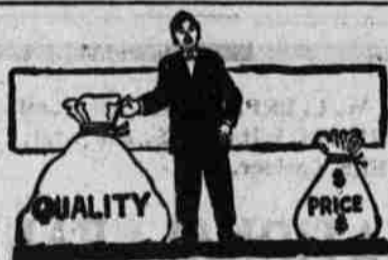

LA GRANDE TAKES BOTH

BOYS WIN BY SCORE OF TWO TO NOTHING

Girls nose out close victory by score of four to five last night

La Grande took two victories last night from the Summerville boys' and girls' teams. The girls scored their first victory for the season when they nosed out a victory by a four to five score. There were no goals from the field, all points being the result of free throws. Both teams played determinedly and it was a matter of player against player that delighted the spectators. The Summerville girls are clever and adopt clean tactics in their playing. The entire game was intensely interesting and marked by good feeling throughout.

The La Grande boys won by a score of 2 to 0. The actual score was 28 to five, which shows very well the relative strength of the two teams, but being left far in the rear, and many of their players un-

trained and unused to the grueling pace set by the locals, four of the Summerville team left the floor a few minutes before the game was up. The team did not leave the floor on account of surplus spleen. Summerville even neglected to accept a free throw offered them just before they retired. In the event of a forfeited game the score was 2 to 0.
