It has been the policy under the direct supervision of F. B. Currey to lend aid where the debtor is striving to "make good" and to punish where punishment is due.

Following out this policy and many other commendable platforms of the association, La Grande's business men have come in one year to be considered a patternmaker for other cities of equal and greater size who still flounder about commercially with credits bad, poor cooperation and general deficiency in connected boosting.
