SHEEPMEN COMPLAIN

BOTH SIDES MEET AT BAKER TO THRESH MATTER.

Apportionment of ranges on Whitman reserve held as unjust.

Contending that the apportionment of stock on the Whitman range has been unfair and inequitable, members of the Baker-Union Woolgrowers, are today holding a meeting with the forestry officials in this city, trying to reach some conclusion that will be satisfactory to all concerned.

The old question has arisen regarding the rights of Wallowa county and Baker county and to this is added the interesting problem of what shall be done with the small cattle owner on the reserves, says the Baker Herald.

Several officials are here and it is the intention of both sides to thresh the matter out thoroughly after which either side may take an appeal to the department at Washington.

About thirty woolgrowers are present and after a long discussion this afternoon it was suggested that the advisory board of the organization meet with the forestry officials and try to adjust matters. This was agreed to, but the question of the small cattle owner is of such importance that it is likely that difficulty will be encountered in taking care of him.

yesterday afternoon after a short illness, will be buried tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock from the Henry & Carr undertakings parlors, with the interment in the Masonic cemetery. Omura was 32 years of age and leaves a wife and several children in Japan.

WESTON TO INITIATE

WILL PUT NORMAL QUESTION BEFORE PUBLIC AGAIN.

Will use initiative in matter of Eastern Oregon normal.

Weston, Ore., Feb. 10.—At a mass meeting held here last night and attended by many representative people, it was voted unanimously to undertake an initiative campaign to secure the continuance of the Eastern Oregon Normal School. A general boosting committee has already been named and on Monday this committee will meet and select an executive committee to draft a bill and to manage the proposed campaign.

At the meeting last night Mayor O. F. Turner acted as chairman and P. S. McKinney as secretary. Many talks were made upon the subject of asking for further support for the school and the general sentiment was found to be heartily in favor of undertaking an initiative campaign.

When the executive committee is named Monday the members of that body will be chosen from other parts of Oregon as well as from Weston. The school being the Eastern Oregon normal it is desired to get the support of this entire section behind the move for maintenance.
