

Activity in Railroad Circles There is a renewed activity in local railroad circles and it is expected that the breaking up of winter will be the signal for the opening up of a great era of railroad building and improvement in Eastern Oregon, says the Pendleton E. O.

A crew of surveyors has been at work for several days setting the grade stakes for the changes which are to be made in the road between this city and Yoakum. A little more than a million dollars will be spent in this work which includes the elimination of curves and the improvement of the road bed.

Inaddition to this, fence building gangs are now being organized to fence the unfenced portions of the roal. The most notable piece in this vicinity being the entire Pilot Rock branch. The posts were ditributed for this work once and then they were gathered up again, but apparently the company now expects to complete the work this time.

With the fencing of this branch line completed, the Condon, Wallowa valley and other branch lines are to be taken care of.
