Bagdad and Eden! All Aboard!

Constantinople, Feb. 18.—Tourists who desire to visit the old homesteads of their ancestors, Adam and Eve, may soon do so in comfort, as the Turkish government today acted upon the application for the construction of a narrow gauge railroad to the site of the Garden of Eden, which Sir William Wilcocks, British Advisor to the Turkish Ministry of Public Works, thinks he has located. According to Sir William's measurements the homestead of Adam and Eve was situated in the Harilah district, about 200 kilometers north of Bagdad. The spot is an oasis situated in the center of a vast desolate plain, which is traversed by four arms of the river Euphrates.

PORTLAND LINE COMING.

Portland, Ore., Feb. 18.—It was announced today that the Home Independent Telephone Company contemplates the extension of its lines over the state of Oregon and making connections with all farmers lines. Work will begin immediately.
