M. I. A. is manifestly a symbol that stands for championship of Union county basketball in 1910. Yet there is a local color which divides "basketball honors" into three distinct classes as follows: All corners school and juvenile. By winning undisputed victories from all these classes, either directly or on a comparative score basis the M. I. A. heads the first named division. The La Grande high schools suffering but one defeat, heads the school division and the juvenile classes, while the B. M. A. in both by victories and declarative statements the champions of the last division. The high school played victoriously up to the last game, losing by a decisive score to the M. I. A. One hundred and ninety-nine points have been rolled up against 77 by their opponents. Imbler lost two game this year. That aggregation, like Summerville are in a class by themselves for the members are general fully matured men. There is more "possibility in the Imbler make up than any other club team in the county, but lack of practice retarded its evolution to the reality. The team scored 179 points against 122 by opponents.

The B. M. A. Juveniles, is on the borderline, another year and the squad will be in senior class for its showing against Imbler, and the high school was encouraging. By the margin of one point each time, peculiarly enough, the B. M. A. wrested victory from the Lambda Chi Alpha, a promising team that excels, principally because each of the members lends himself diligently to winning during the progress of games. The M. I. A. Juniors hold the position of being able to challenge the B. M. A. team to the juvenile championship, but didn't. Making but one appearance on the floor the squad is not entitled to consideration in championship for it flatly refused to meet the other claimant, the B. M. A. Out of all justice to the other two teams which played several games, the championship of this class cannot be accorded the M. I. A. Juniors notwithstanding the fact that their percentage is 100.
