O. A. C. NEWS

Corvallis, Feb. 21—(Special) The exercise of Farmer Week including the special program offered by the School of Domestic Arts attracted 340 men and women to the O. A. C. this year. Of this number 135 are women who are studying the principles of Home Building and 205 are men who are taking the work in fruit growing and general agriculture.

A corps of special lecturers chosen from among the prominent men of the state gave a series of talks on practical problems in fruit growing and farming in the State of Oregon. These proved to be of great interest and were particularly instructive.

The O. A. C. basketball team left Feb. 17 for a trip through the northwest. While on this tour the team will play one game with the Washington State College, two games with the University of Idaho and one game with Whitman.

Two O. A. C. students, Joseph Hall and John Cook have rigged up a wireless telegraph station and are receiving messages daily. They are catching messages from all stations south as far as San Francisco and north as far as the middle of British Columbia. These young men made practically all of their instruments and constructed their station unassisted.
