cougars seen in this city were brought to La Grande today by Messrs Stover and S. T. Goodsey of Union. The animals were shot in the woods near Union and were brought over to this city to claim the bounty. One of the splendid pelts was purchased by Geroge L. Cleaver The size of the animals and the circumstances under which one was killed make them items of interest.

Mr. Goodsey was tracking cougar in the mountains near Union and after having gotten a shot at one, which when shot at, turned tail and fied, was attempting to get another bead on the animal. In doing so he passed under a tree with low hanging branches and at a point eight feet awar stopped to retle a shoestring. While doing so, he happened to glance upward and saw the monster cougar calmly studying him from one of the lowest branches. To kill him at short range was but the work of a moment. He had passed under the animal within easy reach of it. The bounty is \$10.00 for each.

They measured seven feet long when warm, and even when cramped up and stiff are over six feet, six inches long. While they have not been weighed it has been conservatively estimated that 125 pounds is the weight of the male, and the female a trifle less than that. The county bounty will be claimed to-
