DEMONSTRATION IS TRAIN COMING

COME TO ALL CITIES AND TOWNS IN THIS SECTION

Every industry of taste to be lectured on and discussed.

La Grande is to see an O. R. N. demonstration train for the first time this year. Complete announcements for the coming of the train to this section, is made in a Portland paper as follows:

The character of the lectures will be governed somewhat by the general farming conditions at each point visited. For instance at a place like Hood River, the commercial fruit grower will hear something of special interest while wheat and other grain growing will not receive as much prominence. On the other hand in the grain growing districts of crop, and the like, will be put to the front and horticulture will be confined more particularly to the growing of home orchards and small fruit for home consumption.

The train will be in charge of Colonel A. A. Morse, special agent in charge of the freight department, who has been the executive officer on previous demonstration trains.

As the train will be on the road 16 days and will make an average of three stops daily the number of points that will receive the benefit of the demonstration will be approximately 30. All the principal towns of Hood River, Wasco, Sherman, Gilliam, Morrow, Umatilla, Union, Wallowa and Baker counties will be visited. The itinerary will cover the towns on the main line between Hood River and Baker City inclusive, with side trips to the towns of Heppner, Condon, Shanico and Joseph branches.

The stock car will carry several head of fancy stock from the college farm; will be equipped with stalls built on hygienic principles and will have exhibits of apparatus used in barns for the handling and cutting of feed, disposition of manure, etc. Samples of stock food will be shown and their use and merits explained by lectures.

The poultry flat car will carry a colony house such as a farmer can build with a small outlay for materials. The poultry house will show the best methods of arranging nests, for guarding against insect pests and for protecting the health of the poultry. The yard will be properly equipped for feeding and 12 or more high grade egg layers will be exhibited.

The towns practically certain to be visited are the following, but the exact schedule and hours of arrival have not been figured out yet: Hood River, Mosier, The Dalles, Wasco, Morrow, Grass Valley, Glen, Condon, Ione, Heppner, Irrigon, Hermiston, Stanfield, Adams, Asteig, Milton, La Grande, Union, Imbler, Elgin, Wallowa, Enterprise, Joseph, North Powder, Haines and Baker City. It is probable that several other points will be included when the complete itinerary is made up. It is certain that the towns will be visited in the order named, as the train may be sent through to Baker City and work westward. This would reverse the schedule.

As now planned the train that will be sent out will consist of seven exhibit cars and a sleeping and business car for the accommodation of the lecturers and railway officials. In addition a day coach of two may be carried.

The exhibits will include livestock, poultry, dairy machinery, grains, grasses, seeds, fruit, fuel trees and agricultural and horticultural implements.


