NEW RATES TOMORROW

COLONIST PERIOD WILL OPEN UP WITH A RUSH

Low rates will bring many and Union county will profit.

Commencing tomorrow, Spring colonist rates from the East to points in Oregon become effective, and if the railroad officials have sized it up right, all records are to be broken. Tickets can be purchased anywhere in the East to any point in Oregon. Atlanta, Ga., rates are \$46.65, and Missouri river points sell tickets to La Grande or any Oregon point for \$25.

The Commercial Club is planning a systematic effort to get its share of the immigrants for Union county, and the local real estate agents are also on the alert. It is apparent that, from letters received from the East, La Grande is better advertised this year than ever before and should reap a greater harvest in the matter of securing new settlers.

The first of these immigrants will not pass La Grande until about Friday.

LINCOLN RETURNS WITH THAT FACT ASSURED

Boise, Nampa, and Baker City want to get in on League.

Class C baseball under organized protection is now an assured fact for La Grande, unless all indications suddenly crumble to pieces. Grant Lincoln, the local promoter, returned today from a series of conferences at Nampa, Boise and Baker City. All of these towns favor a league, but some points the question was brought up as to the advisability of having in the league the two Oregon towns Baker City and La Grande, because of transportation expenses. Mr. Lincoln is confident these objections are only minor, in fact, they have already been overcome.

That Class C ball is the particular brand desired is also another fact. Yesterday at Baker City Mr. Lincoln conversed with the mining town promoters and found it true there that the "C" brand is desirable.

Nampa has already subscribed considerable money for the club, and will hold another meeting Wednesday to decide definitely. The Boise Commercial Club is behind the promotion there and the capitol city is anxious to get in the game.

By Thursday it will be known definitely just what shape the league is in.

Embryo plans for a Western Idaho league were quashed by the appearance of Lincoln in Boise, as promoter of the Inter-state League. The other plans were immediately dropped in favor of the now popular system.
