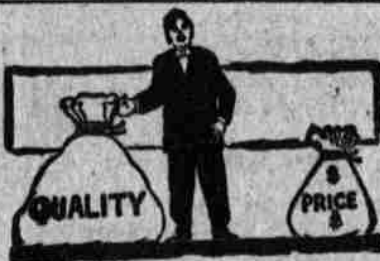

The Eastern Oregon State Teachers Association, comprising Union, Umatilla and Baker counties, will hold their convention at these dates at Pendleton in conjunction with the convention of the Inland Association comprising Idaho, Oregon and Washington. This territory will bring together about 800 teachers and it is planned for every teacher in Union county to be present.
