## THE MIKADO

Rehearsals bring out features of masterpiece in comic opera.

Great interest is being evinced by everyone in the forthcoming production of the Mikado which Miss Louise Kelley has undertaken to give on behalf of the Elks lodge of this city. Rehearsals have now progressed steadily under the musical directions of Mr. Robert Burton, who begin his

professional career at the Savoy Theatre, London, under the direction of Sir Robert Sullivan, the composer. "The Mikado," Sir Arthur, in connection with W. S. Gilbert, the farcicalist, met with such unprecedented success that the Savoy Theatre, London, became for many years the home for comic opera for the English speaking race.

"The Mikado" which Miss Kelley presents, is considered by many to be the most brilliant efforts of both Gilbert and Sullivan, and the forthcoming production is being looked forward to by all of the music lovers with more than ordinary interest.

The chorus is composed of ladies and gentlemen among whom are like a number of the younger set, high school boys and girls being all represented. A chorus of at least 20 voices is being carefully trained and the results are more than gratifying the confidence of those in whose hands this big production has been placed.

The members of the cast are doing most satisfactory work. The "Three Little Maids" are both good to hear and good to look upon. As for the men, the parts from "The Mikado" down are played by the most representative talent in La Grande.
