TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the Common Council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, on the 9th day of February 1910, creating improvement district No. 16, and designating Sixth street as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said Common Council on the 9th day of February, 1910, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all of that portion of Sixth street, in said improvement district as herein-after described, by laying thereon macadam pavement and constructing curbs, the council, within ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvements, order that all said above described improvements be made; that the boundaries of said district to be improved are as follows: All that portion of Sixth street from the south side of Adams avenue, to the north side of "N" avenue. Notice is hereby further given that the council will levy a special assessment on all the property affected and benefited by such improvements for the purpose of paying for such improvements. That the estimated cost of such improvements is the sum of \$2,267.60. That the council will on the 15th day of March 1910, meet at the Council chambers at the hour of 8 o'clock p. m., to consider said estimated cost, and the levy of said assessments, when a hearing will be granted to any person feeling aggrieved by such assessment.

Pueblo, Col., March 7.—(Special)—The Eighteenth National Irrigation Congress, Pueblo, September 26-30, 1910 is assured of the hearty cooperation and support of the state of Oregon, which has, itself, entertained in recent years, this greatest development agency of the country.
