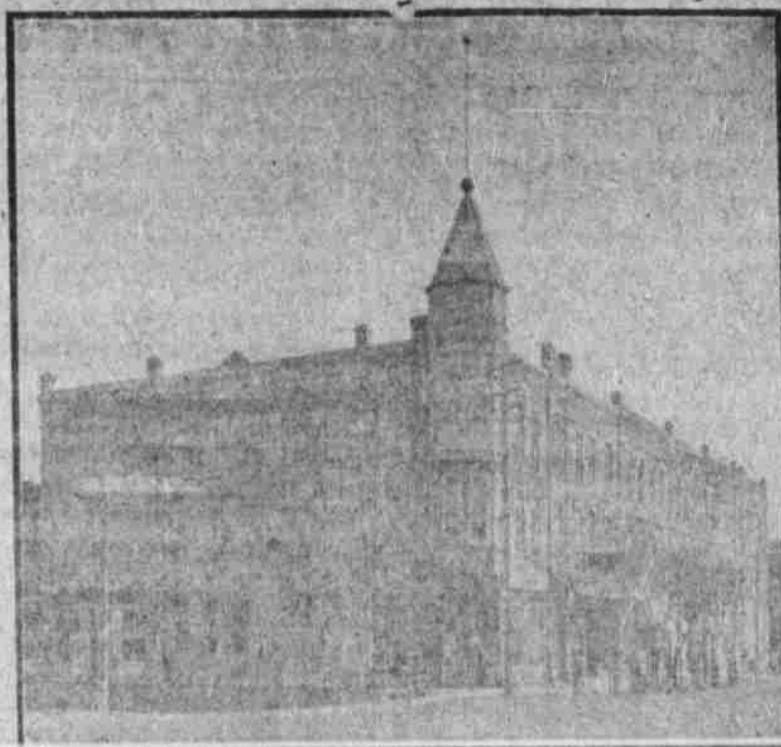

WILL NEED SKIN GRAFT

IF MRS. AMES SURVIVES MUCH SKIN WILL BE NEEDED

Sufferer recovers consciousness and may recover from wounds

If Mrs. A. W. Ames, the woman so terribly burned a few days ago, and now a patient at the Fourth St. Sanatorium, survives, there will become necessary the most stupendous case of skin grafting that has been attempted in this city in many years. If not in the history of surgery here. Late yesterday afternoon Mrs. Ames regained her consciousness and all through the night was conscious of her condition. She failed to rest, however. If her condition today continues to improve as it did last night hopes for her recovery can be entertained. By tomorrow it will likely be known if she can survive. Dr. J. H. Hubbard, the attending physician is encouraged with her condition last night and through most of the day. Public Subscriptions of Skin. A strip across her shoulders, and both hips are the deepest burned.

The finger tips of her left hand are burned off and the front and back part of her right hand is burned up to the wrist. Her limbs are seared from the waist to a point about four inches below the knee. In this way would be impossible to secure skin from her anatomy to "island" the burned parts and a public subscription of skin will become necessary. In the event that this becomes necessary, a month or maybe more, will elapse before any effort will be made to do the grafting.
