

An ordinance declaring a special assesment to pay for the improvement of a portion of Main avenue in best bidder for cash in hand from improvement district no 3 by buildand after April 9th, 1816-on the ang cement sidewalk in front of lot six in Block 10 Grandy's addition to La Grande and diment crosswalk on alley between lot 5 and 6 in said

THE CITY OF LA GRANDE DOES ORDAIN AS KOLLOWS:

Section one-That there is hereby tevied a special assesment against lot 6 in block 10 Granay's addition to La Grande and lot 5 in said block 10 to pay for the improvement of that portion of Main averue in front of said described lots by building a cement sidewalk in front of said lot 6, and a cement crosswalk on the alley between said lot 6 and lot 5 in said block 10 as follows:
