### Another American Jailed

Corinto, Nicaragua, March 15.—Charged with having conspired against the life of President Madriz, George Cannon, cousin of Leroy Cannon, who was executed by Zelaya's orders is held a prisoner here today. The arrest was made with the knowledge of Admiral Kimball, commander of the American naval forces. Cannon was secretary to General Chamorro of the revolutionary army.

### Old Stamp Law Valid.

Jefferson City, Mo., March 15.—The Supreme Court of Missouri today affirmed the constitutionality of the old stamp law which requires the affixing of a 25 cent stamp to papers concerning every deal in futures of grain, provisions and cotton stocks.

### Chinese Minister to Sail

Washington, March 15.—Unless the Secretary of State finds reason for his recall at the last moment, William J. Calhoun, newly appointed minister to China, will sail from San Francisco today on the steamer Tenyo Maru. Government officials are holding their breath, this morning until word is received that the vessel is safely off, with Calhoun on board.

The council passed an ordinance, however, removing the limit from Class A structures which will permit construction of the 26 story L. C. Smith building.
