SISTER ON SAD JOURNEY

HAPPY TRIP TO MEET BROTHER
IS FRUSTRATED

Sister of fireman Hopple crossed con-
tinent to visit him

Pathetic indeed will be the arrival here this evening or tomorrow of Miss Hopple, a sister of Fireman Ed. Hopple, who was instantly killed yesterday morning near Mission.

Miss Hopple left Harrisburg, Pa., several days ago to pay her brother here an extended visit, but the hand of fate has made the trip a funeral journey instead. Miss Hopple was expected here this morning and her arrival is anticipated on every train from the East. Fireman and Mrs. Hollister, where Mr. Hopple roomed, are on the alert and will care for the unfortunate girl as soon as she arrives.

The remains of Hopple were brought in this morning from Pendleton on the first train West. A delegation of about 75 members of the local Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Engineers met the body and escorted it to the Henry & Carr morgue. Funeral arrangements cannot be fixed until the arrival of Miss Hopple, but it is presumed the body will be shipped to Harrisburg for interment.

Another remarkable incident connected with the affair is that two days ago Hopple signed an insurance policy in favor of the sister who was coming to meet him.

Locate Hopple's Brother

The local Brotherhood received telegram this afternoon from W. H. Hopple, a brother of the dead man, at Ely, Nevada. He asked that the body be shipped to Ogden where he will meet it for the journey to the family home at Harrisburg, Pa.

Delegations of firemen met both trains from the East last night on account of the report that Hopple's sister was to arrive from the East on No. 5. Little credence is given to the report late today, as it was possible that she was visiting the brother W. H. Hopple at Ely, and if she had been en route here he would have said something in regard to her arrival in his telegrams.
