This is the week the committees are to make the canvases of the farmers to ascertain whether or not they will sign the irrigation contracts in sufficient numbers to insure the construction of the dam this season.

At present there are ten places in La Grande where beer is sold and in confirmation with the new ordinance passed last evening the license has been raised from \$50 to \$500 for six months and the number limited to six. The council will soon be called upon to decide which six may remain in business.

INVESTIGATE WRECK
Railroad has not announced cause of Iowa Wreck yesterday

Des Moines Ia., March 22.—An investigation of the Rock Island wreck near Reinbeck in which 45 were killed will be undertaken by the railroad commission. Railroad officials have not announced the cause of the wreck. The morgue and hospitals in Marshalltown are crowded with the victims. Most of the dead have been identified.

Taken to Penitentiary.
Council Bluffs, Ia., March 22.—Carefully guarded, John C. Maybray the convicted leader of the gang of fixed race swindlers and seven associates were today taken to Fort Leavenworth to begin serving their two year's imprisonment. Each of the convicted men filed a petition for a new trial.

Taft Still Mum
New York, March 22.—President Taft was a guest of Henry Clews, the banker, at luncheon today. The President refused to discuss the political situation in the state or the insurance scandal. He will attend two banquets tonight, after which he returns to Washington.

ABBREVIATED HAT PINS
Chicago, March 22.—An anti-hat pin ordinance was passed by the city council last night. When the ordinance came up for vote a large crowd of women in the gallery started a demonstration. The councilmen, however, proceeded to cast ballots with the result that the measure carried by a vote of 68 to 2. The ordinance prohibits any woman wearing a hat pin which protrudes more than half an inch from the crown of the hat, is liable to arrest and a fine of \$50.

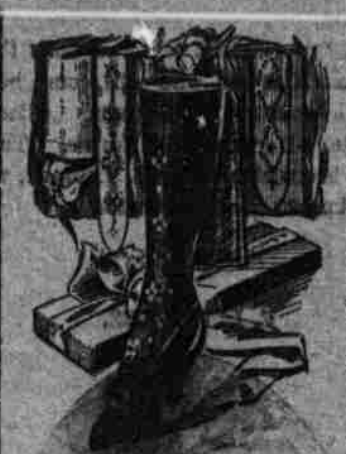

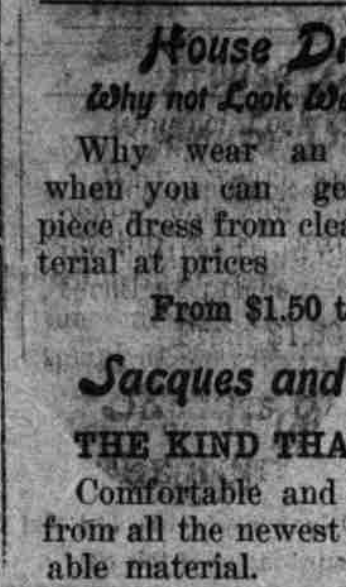
