Boise, March 22.—Special to Observer.—Although no definite action was taken up to a late hour this afternoon, Nampa has practically decided to join with Boise, Baker City and La Grande in a four-club interstate league for the season of 1910. This is the result of a conference held last night in this city and this morning at Nampa where the intermountain magnates were in session. ### PINCHOT IS SUMMONED

Washington, March 22.—Clifford Pinchot is hurrying to Europe to meet Roosevelt at the latter's request. The fact was revealed today by a close friend of Pinchot who declared the former forester was summoned by cablegram from Khartoum.

Pinchot is now nearing England and it was planned for him to join the former president at Paris. It could not be learned whether Pinchot was to stay in Paris until the arrival of Roosevelt or if he is to proceed to Naples to meet him. Roosevelt is not due in Paris for over a month.

Pinchot said before he sailed that he had planned to meet Roosevelt before the latter sailed for Africa, and the trip was merely consummation of plans already formed.

The message sent Pinchot was very urgent, it is declared and it is believed his hasty departure indicates that the meeting is not to be held in Paris, but that Pinchot will hasten on to meet him en route.

#### Colonel Visits Thebes

Luxor, March 22.—Colonel Roosevelt arose at six this morning and started on a long horseback ride to visit the ruins of the ancient city of Thebes. He lunched with Theodore Davis, a prominent antiquarian, and returned to Luxor in the afternoon. He will leave for Cairo tomorrow.
