**Cambridge and Oxford Row**  
London, March 23.—Sport-loving London is depopulated of its rowing enthusiasts today and an unprecedented crowd is lined up along the Thames this morning, eagerly waiting the contest of skill, strength and endurance between the "Wet Bobs" of Cambridge and Oxford. The course, as usual, is from Putney to Mortlake. Oxford adherents believe that institution will repeat its victory of last year when the dark blue oarsmen won for the first time since 1905. Cambridge men are quite as hopeful for the success of the light blue crew, and to the outsider the indications are all for a close and exciting contest.

Today's regatta is the 67th dual rowing meet between Oxford and Cambridge. Of the past events, Oxford has won 35 and Cambridge 20, while one, in 1877, was a dead heat.

The distance of the course is a little short of four miles. The best record was made in 1893, by Oxford, time 18 minutes and 47 seconds. In 1900 the Cambridge crew exactly repeated this time, so the rivalry in that respect is ven. While both universities have good crews in today's race, it is hardly expected the record will be equalled. The time of Oxford's winning crew last year was 19 minutes and 50 seconds. Of the last 12 regattas Cambridge has won eight, tending to prove that the light blue oarsmen are tending of late years to superiority over their ancient rivals.
