

## STREAMS DO MUCH DAMAGE

LADD CREEK, FIVE POINTS AND OTHERS ARE HIGH.

County roads and bridges in many sections of county hurt.

Recent flood water have left in their wake a long string of ruined county roads. Ladd creek, during its recent high water stage tore out the Ladd creek canyon road in many places and it will be some time before the highway can be fully repaired.

Clark creek near Elgia was also destructive. Bridges along the upper district of that stream have been washed away and much damage done in a general way to the highway running along the stream.

Five Points creek, in the upper sections, is just now commencing to do damage to county roads and to bridges along its path.

The new road at Perry, though damaged slightly, stood the test well and is now repaired again. Patrols are stationed along its borders, however, to prevent a gradual undermining during the high water.

### NO TROUBLE ON C. R. OF O.

Reports from headquarters this morning—Trains running on time

Manager England of the C. R. of O. said today that there was no trouble along the line from Union to Cove. Reports to the effect that trains between the two towns have been delayed on account of bridges being washed out and other troubles from high water are false. The only delays on the road have been caused by the lateness of trains on the main line which the branch trains have to meet for mail and passengers.

### Ordinance No. 450, Series 1910.

An ordinance authorizing and directing the Mayor and Recorder to purchase from Walter W. Pollock, certain real estate, for sewer purposes, and to fix a price paid therefor.

The City of La Grande does ordain as follows:

Section 1.—That the Mayor and Recorder of the City of La Grande, Oregon, be, and they are hereby authorized and directed to purchase from Walter W. Pollock the following real estate, to-wit: Blocks 13 and 14 in East Addition to the town of La Grande, at a price not to exceed the sum of \$3000.

Section 2.—Inasmuch as the City now holds an option on said above described property, at the price above named, and can secure the same for said consideration, and it is expedient and necessary that the City purchase said property to be used in connection with the proposed sewer system, now under way, in order to secure the peace, health and welfare of the City, immediately, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in force and take effect, on and after its approval by the Mayor, and its publication in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer on the 24th day of March, 1910.

Passed the Council on the 21st day of March, 1910, by eight members voting therefor.

Approved this 22d day of March, 1910.

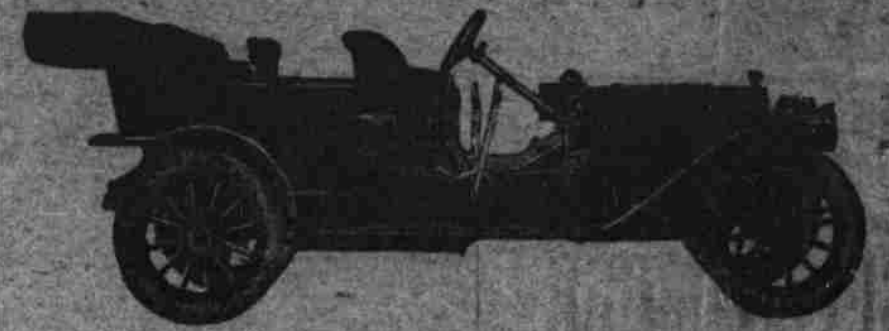

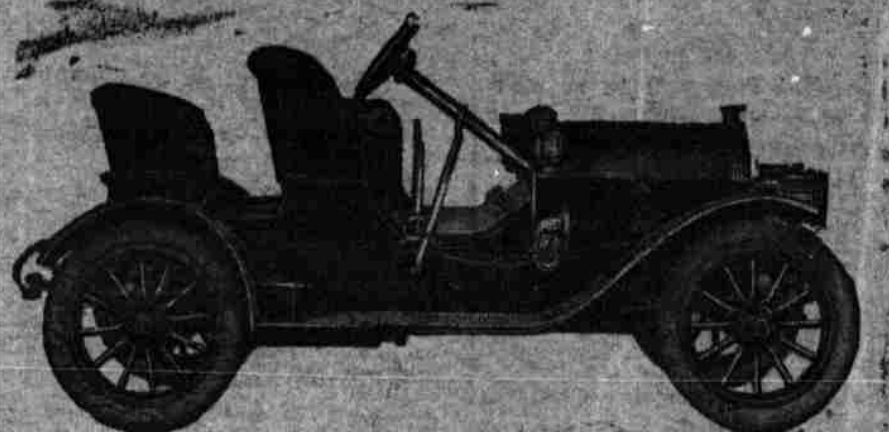
