MANY TRAPPED BY DIVERG. ING STREAMS OF THE LAVA

Catania, Sicily, March 25 .- The eruption of Mount Asina is growing in intensity every hour. Six new craters were opened up today and shot forth streams of lava which have joined the boiling torrent that is despoiling cities, towns and farms. Peasants Flee to Safety

The tows of Bolello, Belpassos, San Leo, Rinazzi Copello, Albaello and Nicolosi have been wholly or partially destroyed. Thousands are fleeing from the mountain towns. It is feared the disaster may prove to be one of the most destructive of modern times. There are now 18 craters pouring forth sulphurous vapors, stones and ashes, while each is an overwhelming well of molten lav. Clouds of smoke pouring from the craters obscure the sun and increase the superstitious fears of the peas-

Resemble Mesina Disaster

Scenes following the destruction of the mountain town resmble those Vollowing the Messian earthquake, ror stricken men, women and children are coming to Catiania. Already the authorities are facing a serious problem in caring for the homeless.

Lava Streah Like River Government engineers are vainly endeavoring to avert destruction of the towns in the path of the lava torrent by erecting dykes and diging trenche to divert the stream. An irrisistable torrent of hot mud and bolling lava has swept away all obstruction. The lava is traveling at a speed of 1800 feet an hour. The main stream is 50 feet deep and half a mile wide.

Inhabitants Caught by Streams Word has been received here that scores of refugees have been cut off

by diverging streams of lava and volenteers have left for the scene. Many thrilling rescues were made. In addition to the lava, inhabitants of the mountain towns are threatened by death by outpouring of rocks and the showers of hot ashes from the main

The extent of the disaster measured by property loss is enormous.
